Mother Katherine Drexel

Little Flower's founder, Msgr. Bernard Quinn was not alone in his quest of creating a sanctuary for neglected children. After the Klu Klux Klan burned down the beginnings of the Wading River campus, he was able to rebuild with the assistance of Sister Katherine Drexel.

During this time, she was also assisting the African-American and Native American communities across the country. Not only did she help Msgr. Quinn rebuild, she also offered and provided the services of the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament who helped in getting the orphanage and school up and running.



Sisters of the Holy Family of Nazareth

In 1937, taking the place of the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament, 24 Sisters came to Little Flower's Wading River campus to staff the school and children's home. At this time, they helped Msgr. Quinn with 283 children.

Today, 82 years later, there are five Sisters of the Holy Family of Nazareth still living and working on the Wading River campus!
