Little Flower has transformed caring into action to improve the well-being of the families in our care since 1929. We remain committed to our children, families, and individuals with developmental disabilities through this pandemic and will be there for them well after.



Our essentials workers - caseworkers, child care workers, direct care professionals, nurses, therapists, facilities, and maintenance teams - are showing up 24/7 to ensure the safety of the Little Flower community. During these uncertain times, we have provided stability and continued care.

- Weekly telephone calls/FaceTime visits with children and families keep families connected and gauge their adjustment to the "new normal"
- In-person visits are scheduled only when the conditions prove safe
- Telehealth provides mental health therapy sessions to meet the needs of both the child and parent and ensures children are receiving their medications and therapy services
- Care coordinators and service providers continue services and support and crisis management over the phone
- Structured days with built-in recreation time and outdoor activity for our young residents
- Direct care staff are finding innovative, new ways for our adult residents to learn, live and have fun at home

Our world may look different, but the care and dedication to those we serve that depend on us remains the same, strong and true.

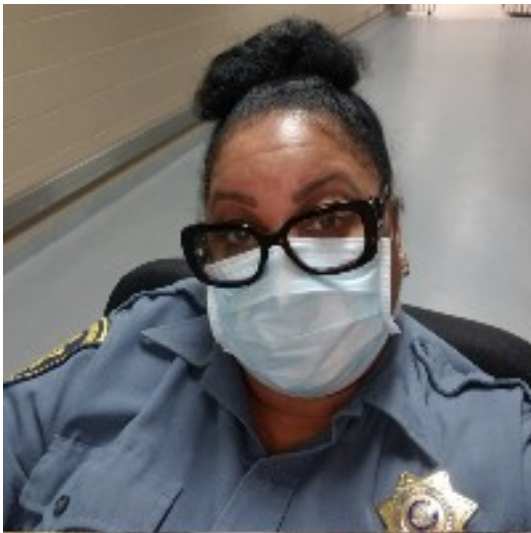

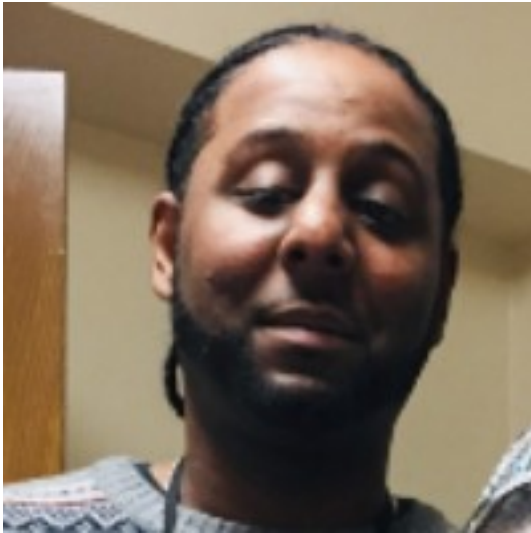
Help us show them that their hard work has not gone unnoticed and how much we appreciate all they do for the vulnerable groups that depend on them.
